**£398,511** grant funding committed in 2018/19 for maintenance and minor repairs\*

---

**Maintenance:** The act of implementing programmed cyclical works, carried out on a regular basis, to keep a building from deteriorating or preserve an existing condition/situation. The objective of the maintenance task is to protect the significance of historic fabric and keep buildings stable and weather tight. A maintenance task is one that extends the life of the building or the historic interest and contributes to the general upkeep of the asset using current good practice.

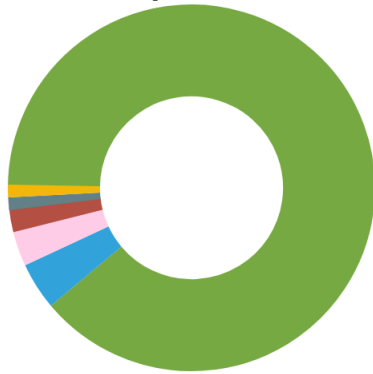
**Minor repair:** the act of physical small scale intervention to restore something damaged, faulty or worn. Conservation repairs, rather than wholesale replacement, should be as limited as possible in scope but achieve conservation objectives. Repair work should reduce the risk that the building faces in a direct way, by preventing loss of or damage to important architectural features.

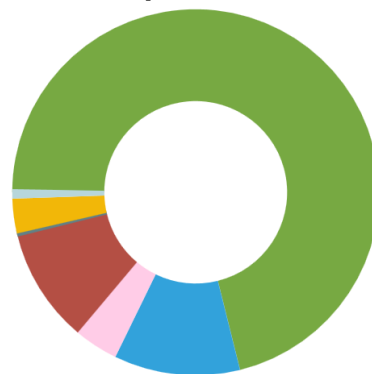
### Taylor Review Pilot Progress Update
